

Human Trafficking: The Facts

Sex Trafficking	Forced Labor
\$100 billion annually	\$150 billion annually
 Females: 80% victims/ 42% recruiters 	 Immigrants/refugees. 71% lawful visas (U.S.)
 Average age of entry: 12-14 	44% moved international; sexually exploited
1 of 6 endangered runaways trafficked	26% juveniles
 Male victims mostly juveniles under 13 exploited by military and rebel units in Middle East and Africa (e.g. bacha bazi) 	 Domestic servants, farms, factories, door-to-door sales, restaurants, construction, carnivals, massage, beauty & nail salons, child soldiers.
4.5MM current victims globally	21MM victims; 1.5MM in US/Europe
Drug Cartels, Hostile States, Terrorist Groups, Transnational Criminal Organizations (TCO)	
Victims' lives often end from organ trafficking	



Human Trafficking: The Human Toll



Sex Trafficking

- Victims at times raped by a dozen or more men, 12 to 20 hours per day
- Victims often forced into drug and alcohol addiction
- Romeo complex with abusive pimps and handlers; significant mental and emotional abuse
- Failure to meet quotas may result in physical and sexual abuse, starvation, and torture
- Victims afraid and cautious of law enforcement; if accused of "ratting" on the group, punishment could be torture, organ removal, and/or death.
- Every aspect of victim's life is controlled, from communication/technology to personal identification documents, bank accounts, and even tax returns.
- Local "pimp" is a thing of the past; exploiters are part of multi-echelon global threat organizations.
- Second most profitable illicit trade in the world.

Human Trafficking: AMP Model

ACT

The ACT of recruiting, transporting, transferring, harboring, or receiving a person; think **SMUGGLING**

International – e.g.
Russian, Ukrainian, Italian,
Chinese, Brazilian, Albanian,
Lebanese, Serbian, and
Mexican crime syndicates.

Import – e.g. Immigration law subversion at the Mexican border.

Export – e.g. Movement of persons from Ohio over Lake Erie into Canada.

Between Cities – e.g. L.A. to San Jose

MEANS

By MEANS of coercion, deception, or abuse of vulnerability; think *FORCED*

Human Trafficking Disproportionally Affects:

At-risk juveniles - runaways, and those with previous sexual abuse

Minority Females -African-American, Hispanic, and Asian females

LBGTQ Communityparticularly gay and transgender men

Non-English speaking Foreign Nationals

Refugees from war-torn conflict regions

PURPOSE

For THE PURPOSE of exploitation; think CLASSIFICATION.


<u>Labor</u> – Often the result of "debt servitude" from cross-border smuggling

Arranged Marriage – Disproportionally affects Arab, African, and certain Asian jurisdictions.

Sex Trafficking/ Prostitution – Includes numerous sub-classifications, including child pornography, digital bazaar, online dating/personals, massage parlor/nail salon, highend escort, and street-level prostitution.

Organs – Organ removal may follow career in forced labor or prostitution.
